

Meeting CIPS-IGFA in Budapest

On the occasion of the EFTTEX 2017 in Hungarian capital, in the Hotel Gellért Budapest was held a meeting of the CIPS President Mr. Ferenc Szalay and the IGFA President Mr. Rob Kramer.

First reason for this meeting was to sign the Memorandum of Understanding between the two organisations: Confédération Internationale de la Pêche Sportive (CIPS) and the International Game Fishing Association (IGFA) recognising each other's efforts in promoting the sport fishing and the recreational angling; and to state their intention to strengthen the cooperation and common efforts in the interests of the angling.



The CIPS President Ferenc Szalay and the IGFA President Rob Kramer signed the document.

It is a logical continuation of our cooperation launched already years ago in the international organizations - said Mr. Szalay - a very important step of the common and united efforts for the future of the angling. And of course we have confirmed this intention at many international conferences like in FAO, ICCAT and the others. We are both fully aware that environmental protection, the protection of nature, of the environment and fish is a precondition for angling's future. With this Memorandum we confirmed our willingness to further concrete common efforts.

It is an important, I could say: historical step of the cooperation of our organizations - Mr. Kramer confirmed - and of the continuation of our common efforts in the international organizations. One of the main objectives of IGFA is to protect and promote the game angling; so we are very satisfied with this common agreement.
